




















Circuit Trail Concept

- 1) Develop new connections
- 2) Create Overlay Zones
 - Promote bike/ped friendly development
 - Adaptive reuse, infill development
- 3) Conduct a “Walkability Audit”
 - Wayfinding
 - Safety
- 4) Branding
 - Associate with walkway but not to lose individual identity
- 5) Replicate in other areas



